

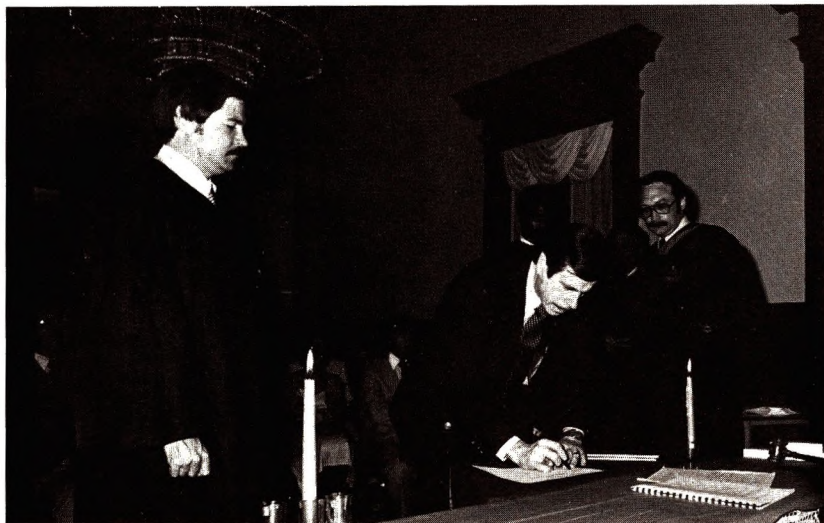

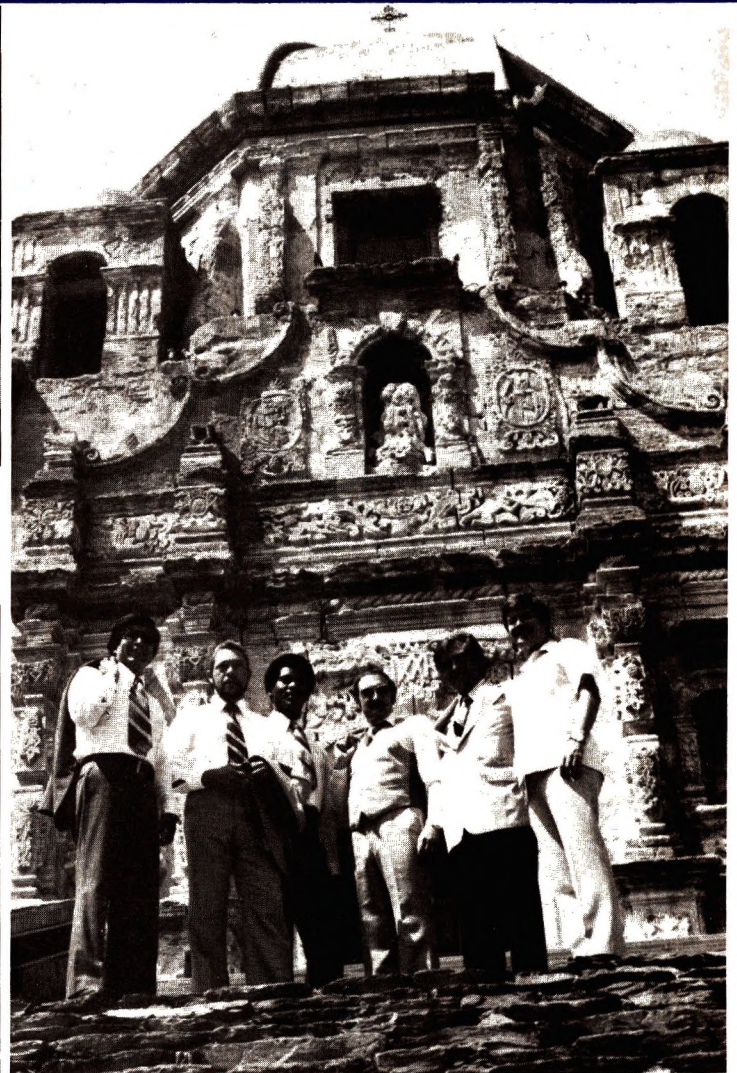

Weitkamp Concludes Term As PFA President

Professional fraternity leaders from across the United States and Canada met at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Tennessee September 27-29, 1979 for the annual Convention of the Professional Fraternity Association. Presiding at the Convention was President Fredrick J. Weitkamp, Executive Director of PAD.

This interfraternity organization comprises 35 national and international fraternities in 15 professional fields. It was formed through the merger of the Professional Interfraternity Conference and the Professional Panhellenic Conference.

Their principal speaker during the Convention meeting was the Hon. William Leech, Attorney General of the State of Tennessee and a member of McReynolds Chapter from the University of Tennessee.

Incoming President is Marilyn Haberle of Lambda Kappa Sigma Pharmacy Fraternity. Weitkamp continues on the Board of Directors in his capacity as Immediate Past President.

Board Meets In Nashville, TN

(It is the policy of the International Executive Board to invite a student representative to attend each Board meeting. Dorothy Bell of Lurton Chapter attended the August meeting and set forth below are her impressions of the meeting.)

The meeting of the International Executive Board was, as the Executive Director had suggested it would be, "an experience unlike any other." A glance at the Board's meeting room, with an array of soft drinks, coffee cups, and numerous boxes of "Goo Goo Bars," might imply that the week was a rather social affair. Although the Executive Board members did find time to be sociable, to visit some Nashville tourist attractions, and even to jog at dawn, the social events were not priority items. A full agenda and closed-door sessions until the evening hours dominated the week's schedule.

Reports by committees and individuals were thorough and evidenced a high degree of analysis. Consequently the response by the Board members was marked with sincere interest. All persons who

attended the meeting — including the student observer — had the opportunity to comment and criticize the materials presented for review. Only Board members voted. (It is a pleasure to note that the Executive Officers do not "rubber stamp" during their voting sessions.)

Alumni and student chapter matters received much attention throughout the executive session. The number of student initiates appears to have plateaued and the Board's desire for increased student membership is a realistic concern. Nevertheless, it is the strong belief of some Board members that the plateau situation is not a "bad" situation — i.e. it is better than decreased student membership. On the other hand, the percentage of alumni activity has not maintained an impressive level for a considerable period of time. Alumni affairs warrant special attention from all sectors of the fraternity, not just from the Executive Board.

Image building was a major, if not the major, area of interest during the week of meetings. Within the next year, fraternity members should receive a report from the

PAD Expands To Mexico

First Chapter Is Installed In Monterrey

On October 5, 1979 PAD installed its first Chapter in Mexico at the Universidad Regiomontana. Officiating over the ceremonies were: International Justice Frank McCown, Past Supreme Justice C. Raymond Judice, District VIII Justice Shad Jefferies, former Executive Secretary Jim McLean and deDiego Chapter Justice Abelardo Le Compte.

Also initiated into the Fraternity as charter members of the new Chapter were the rector (president) of the university, Dr. Agustin Basave Fernandez Del Valle, Dean Ricardo Trevino Garcia of the law school, Dr. Baudelio Castillo Flores and a number of law professors.

The entire initiation ritual was conducted in Spanish with translation by deDiego Chapter Justice Abelardo Le Compte. At the conclusion of the initiation ceremony

the rector, Director and Dean were presented with PAD engraved gold cross pen and pencil sets.

The law school at the Universidad Regiomontana was established some five years ago and currently has an enrollment of 300 students. It is housed in its own separate building in the heart of the University's downtown collection of buildings.

The City of Monterrey is a city of 1½ million people located not far

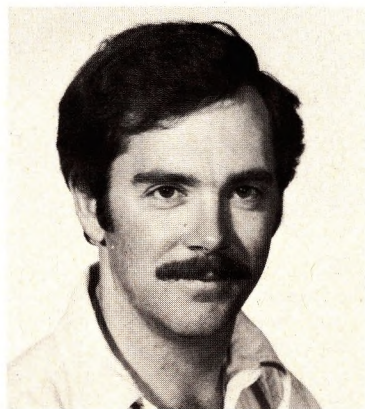

Professor Smithers has long been a mainstay of PAD at the law school and has previously served on the International Executive Board of the Fraternity. In attendance were District Justice George Kaneklides, Professor Fredrick T. Gray, law school Dean Thomas A. Edmonds and other PAD Officers and dignitaries.

south of the Texas border. It is the capital city of the State of Nuevo Leon and as such is the home of the State Governor, State Legislature and State Supreme Court.

The University itself is a private urban university with a total student enrollment of 7,000, which was originally chartered in 1917.

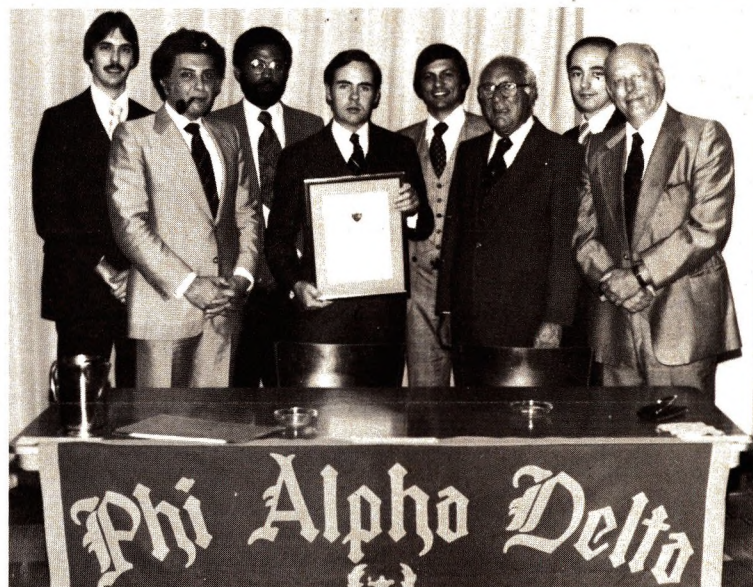

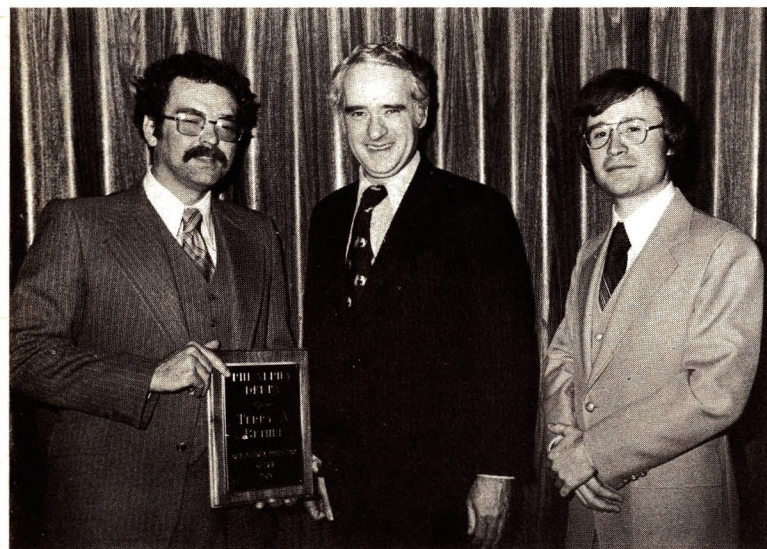
