

In order for an alumni chapter to be in good standing and to qualify for the monetary allowance, it must have met the following requirements:

- 1. The annual alumni chapter tax of \$15.00 must be paid for the two fiscal years commencing July 1, 1984 and ending June 30, 1986.



It provides membership in a Fraternity of firsts, the first to admit women, (by merging with Phi Delta Delta, the women's leading law Fraternity), the first to lift the caucasian only restriction, and the first Fraternity to say that we care enough about juveniles and their legal problems to form a Juvenile Justice System to help them understand their rights and what the law means to them.

Phi Alpha Delta has taken the lead in bridging the gap from college to law school by establishing a Pre-Law Program, designed to familiarize pre-law students with all aspects of law school life. The Pre-Law Program, is another example of the commitment to the legal profession by PAD. It helps pre-law students not only make an informed decision as to what school to attend, but even more important it helps them answer the question, "Do I want to go to law school?"

Probably the most important benefit of membership in PAD, however, is the bond of fraternalism that it offers. The bond that unites over 115,000 lawyers, judges, law students and pre-law students, for life, in a common goal of service to the law school, law student, law profession and the community. 

The U.S. Army Claims Service is the agency through which the Secretary of the Army and the Judge Advocate General discharge their responsibilities for the administrative settlement of claims under the authority conferred on them by certain statutes, regulations, agreements and directives.

The scope of the Army Claims Program is international in nature and involves the annual obligation of almost One Hundred Million Dollars in the settlement of approximately 160,000 claims.

The Services Carrier Recovery Program involves collection action on a subrogation basis against commercial carriers and warehouse men who, while under government contract, have damaged and/or lost property of Army personnel. Recoveries are undertaken as follow-up actions after government payment of personal property claims which are filed.

The receipt adjudication and payment of claims are executed by approximately 185 offices worldwide.

A recently acquired mission of the service is that of affirmative claims, which is the collection of monies due the United States Army as a result of third party negligence or wrong doing. The program generates approximately Ten Million Dollars in collections in favor of the United States Government each year.

The office also represents the United States Army in administrative claims failed against the government for alleged negligent acts of employees. The scope of the problem is illustrated by the fact that there are presently pending approximately One Billion Dollars in medical malpractice claims against the United States.
