



U. Of Oklahoma Chapter **Reports Outstanding Year**

Harlan Chapter at the University of Oklahoma reports that it concluded a most outstanding year for 1986-87

One of its members, Andrea Foster, was a member of the law school's BALSA National Moot Court Competition which won the national competition March 20,

The chapter has sponsored a Juvenile Justice program which discusses various topics of the law with high school students in a question and answer format. It is designed to make students more aware of the law and problems which may exist in a particular area of the law.

It also assisted the University in a minority recruitment program. The program is designed to encourage minority students to attend the University of Oklahoma Law School. Chapter members spoke to pre-law students about PAD as well as the law school.

The chapter is also interfacing with the University of Oklahoma Pre-Law Chapter. Last February, it distributed old law school textbooks to prelaw members who welcomed them with open arms.

The chapter also utilizes various fund raising events. One successful event was that of a study aid sale and buy back. This event gives students an opportunity to purchase study aids at a price much less expensive than the University's book store. It also provides them an opportunity to sell their old study aids.

Harlan Chapter also sponsors a lending library which provides books to PAD members at very inexpensive rental rates. PAD members may rent books for \$2.00 per semester while non-members rent them for \$5.00 per semester.

Paterson Chapter Goes To Washington

For the past few years, Paterson Chapter of Phi Alpha Delta has been sponsoring an annual Supreme Court Trip. This year, it was held the weekend of February 27th through March 2nd. The main purpose of the trip was to see the Supreme Court on Monday, March 2nd.

Those going on the trip spent most of the weekend sightseeing in the nation's Capitol. Taking in the monuments, museums and other tourist attractions was quite tiring, but we all managed to spend at least some time in Georgetown nonetheless.

The highlight of the trip was listening to oral arguments at the Supreme Court. As it turned out, March 2nd was the first day the Supreme Court was hearing oral arguments this year. The arguments were quite interesting, ranging from a case about the right to counsel to a case dealing with the National Labor Relations Board. Being in the same courtroom with the nine foremost legal jurists in the country was indeed impressive.

Following the oral arguments, the group was given a guided tour of the Supreme Court Building. Afterwards, some ventured over to the Capitol across the street, while others tried to get that last bit of sightseeing in before our return to Seton Hall. By Tuesday, Washington was just a memory and it was back to the same old law school routine.

There are now 676,852 lawyers nationwide, which is almost double the number of lawyers in 1970. It is estimated that by the year 2000 there will be one million lawyers.




A BIENNIUM OF ETHICAL ACHIEVEMENT


This action by PAD could not come at a more important time for our Profession. We as lawyers — and those who would be lawyers — are faced

McQuade, a Washington, D.C. attorney, also holds the distinction of being named one of the 10 Most Outstanding Young Women of America for 1985. Her career shows a steady record of achievement and distinction including both civic service and professional activity.

1987-88 LRE Grant **Extension Approved**

The office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention recently approved the 12th consecutive grant award to the Phi Alpha Delta Public Service Center for a 12-month extension of the law-related education program, effective June 15, 1987. This supplemental award, amounting to \$200,230, will bring the total LRE funding by OJJDP for the Fraternity to \$1.5 million since February

This 1987-88 program will be targeted in 34 states, with nine new states to be added. Such states are named below:

The principal role of the Service Center under the new grant will be to generate in the 34 states an attitude of receptivity, leadership potential, a willingness to support and a commitment to participate in project activities among the following groups: bar associations; judges and court systems; prosecutors; law enforcement officers, state and local government officials; and community groups such as PTA's, Chambers of Commerce, Junior Leagues, etc. We will be providing training for such participants and assisting in recruiting them to assist in classroom and field trip LRE activities.

These volunteer services by PAD members, in cooperation with local educators, will serve the key objective of enabling states and local school systems to continue and expand their training and dissemination activities as OJJDP support gradually diminishes. This is called "institutionalization

Finally, PAD is fully committed to the involvement of racial and ethnic minorities and women in LRE program activities and community outreach in these states.
