

# CONTINUING A CENTURY OF LEGAL EXCELLENCE

In 1897 the Lambda Epsilon Fraternity was created out of controversy. Some five years later it would end, but not before giving birth to our dear Phi Alpha Delta. At the third Grand Chapter of Lambda Epsilon in July of 1902, members called for its dissolution, simultaneously writing the Articles of South Haven.

Those Articles were the founding documents of what today is the world's largest and most prestigious international legal organization. On November 8, 1902 a meeting of the new fraternity was held at 45 Monroe Street, Chicago, Illinois. At that meeting the name Phi Alpha Delta was chosen, a new constitution, ritual and rules were

adopted. A comprehensive plan for governing the fraternity was created, and is still used today.

November 8, 2000 marked the 98<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our founding, and our annual Founders Day. At the 53<sup>rd</sup> Biennial Convention it was decided to make that day the beginning of a Biennium long celebration of our Centennial, culminating at the 54<sup>th</sup> Biennial Convention. Over the course of the next two years there will be several special events and celebrations planned. Not the least of which will be our Biennial Convention in August of 2002.

The past of Phi Alpha Delta has been long and glorious. It is the duty of each

# BRENDA J. HOLLIS HONORARY INITIATION

Brenda J. Hollis served for 23 years in the United States Air Force, first as an Intelligence Officer and then as a Judge Advocate, retiring in 1998 with the rank of Colonel. During most of her career as a Judge Advocate she served as a prosecutor, either at the trial or appellate level. She served tours of duty in Germany, the Republic of Korea and Thailand. Her military decorations include two Legions of Merit, six Meritorious Service Medals, two Commendation Medals, the Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Device and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

The United Stated government seconded Ms. Hollis to the Office of the Prosecutor, United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY) from July 1994 until July 1997. During that period Ms. Hollis acted as a Team Legal Officer. In that capacity she participated in the first investigative missions into Bosnia in 1994, in the first investigative mission into Prijedor, including collecting evidence from the Omarska death camp, and acted as co-counsel in the Tadic case, the first litigated war crimes prosecution to be conducted before an international tribunal since WW II.

In 1998 Ms. Hollis returned to the Office of the Prosecutor in the position she holds today, Senior Trial Attorney. In that capacity she has served as lead counsel in several cases, including the first genocide prosecution in the ICTY, the first case that charged rape as torture, and is currently the lead counsel in the Krajisnik case, involving the highest ranking accused to be brought to the ICTY to date. Ms. Hollis was also lead counsel in the Tadic appeal, wherein she developed the legal framework for Prosecution appellate submissions. Ms. Hollis is also Chief of the Team Legal Officer and Co-Counsel Section, in which capacity she supervises 29 senior prosecutors who are involved in all investigations and trials conducted by the Office of the Prosecutor.

It was Phi Alpha Delta's pleasure to initiate Ms. Hollis into the Hughes Chapter on Friday, August 4, 2000 as an Honorary Member. In addition, we have honored her with the Tom C. Clark Equal Justice Under the Law Award. We welcome Ms. Hollis as our newest sister.


When I look at the huge collection of nametags I have assembled on my office wall, I have to look back on all the wonderful






Governor and Brother Mel Carnahan

# HISTORY

# Part VI of IX The Golden Anniversary

by C. Raymond Judice

Continued from the Spring issue of The Reporter. Each edition of The Reporter features the History of the Fraternity.

October 1952 saw clouds of death again hover over the Fraternity with the death of former Supreme Justice John Doyle Carmody. But, again death gives rise to birth, as two years later the Carmody Chapter was chartered at Syracuse University.

The February, 1953 issue of *The Reporter* contained an article on the Calhoun Scholarship Fund of Phi Alpha Delta. This fund of \$13,285.86 represented contributions by members of the Calhoun Chapter at Yale University for the purpose of erecting a suitable fraternity house on the campus. Because of the many changes at the law school it became impractical to use this fund for the purpose for which it was collected so it was turned over to the law school to be used for scholarships.

Maintaining the momentum of the Golden Years, Phi Alpha Delta was continuing to expand at a rapid clip. Abraham Lincoln Chapter was chartered in April 1953, at the John Marshall Law School in Chicago. A month later the George Wythe Chapter was chartered at William and Mary University in Williamsburg, Virginia. Chapter visitations by national officers were now a common occurrence. In 1953, Executive Secretary Weitkamp visited Pinckney at the University of South Carolina, Clay at the University of Kentucky, Champ Clark at Washington University in St. Louis, John L. Sullivan at St. Louis University, More at Creighton University in Omaha, Reese at the University of Nebraska, and Sutherland at the University of Utah.

Far-reaching planning and decisionmaking by the Supreme Executive Board now became commonplace. At its meeting in 1953 the Board approved the chartering of the Arkansas Alumni Chapter. Next, the Board decided that the Fraternity should participate in the annual meetings of the Association of American Law Schools. The Board decided to suspend dues obligations for alumni members who were serving on active duty in the United Stated military forces. The Board also approved the issuance of membership cards. Finally, the Board scheduled the 1954 Biennial Convention in Des Moines, Iowa.

The year 1954 featured several important events for the Fraternity. The Summers Hardy Chapter was chartered at the University of Tulsa on January 30, 1954. The Alabama Alumni Chapter was chartered on April 30. Brother Goodwin Knight became the Governor of California. Brother Thomas A. Burke. Mayor of Cleveland was named to succeed Brother Robert A. Taft in the United States Senate. Brother M. T. Phelps was named the Chief Justice of Arizona. During this same year Asahel W. Gage, one of the founders of the Fraternity and a member of Blackstone Chapter, died.

The Thirtieth Biennial Convention convened in September 1954, in Des Moines, Iowa. The Keynote speaker was Judge Elwyn Thomas of the Florida Supreme Court, who urged the delegates to pursue the proper administration of justice, and "to present cases concisely to the court so that the salient points will stand out against a background of concisely stated facts." Judge Thomas also spoke of his long standing experience within the Fraternity "I am tempted to indulge considerably in what I like to call 'nostalgia' Thirty-nine years ago I attended the Phi Alpha Delta Convention in San Francisco, and I well remember some of the things that happened there. I remember a song about Frank Angellitto: 'Angellitto. He's a damn fine man. Isn't he a dandy? He sets them all a-crazy. Eins, zwei, drei, vier, Andei's going to buy the beer. Rah for Angellitto; he a damn fine man!'

"I remember Edgar A. Jonas, Supreme Justice of the Fraternity at the time, and George L. Steward, who succeeded him; I remember David Schultz, who came to our state from Yale University, and to the amazement of everyone managed to establish a chapter of Phi Alpha Delta. At that time, I think, the nearest chapter was at the University of Virginia. Dave was a great promoter and he promoted himself right into the Governor's chair in Florida." . . .
