

#### Message from the International Justice

Incoming IJ Address to Convention Assembled
Hyatt Regency Lexington, Lexington, Kentucky
August 11, 2018

Thank you, everyone! Well I guess I'm your new International Justice. I'd like to thank immediate past International Justice Kitty Maloney

for her leadership over the past two years—we made a great team. I also thank the most recent International Executive Board for their service in helping move Phi Alpha Delta forward and position it in becoming the premier cutting edge organization we all hope it can be. Many thanks to those who have been District Justices, Assistant District Justices, Alumni Chapter Officers, Law and Pre-Law Chapter Officers, and Sisters and Brothers who worked on various committees, councils, and special projects throughout the past biennium. You are the backbone of Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity, International, and without you and your service, we would not be able to move forward. To the friends of Phi Alpha Delta, who have supported the fraternity—Thank you! To our families, and in particularly mine, thank you for your support. We could not do this without you.

As we move forward, occasionally we need to stop to honor our history—those who came before us, and enjoy what we get out of this wonderful organization of ours, however, we need to remember where we came from and continue to work at improving the Fraternity. Remember, like anything else, you only get out of Phi Alpha Delta what you put into it.

When I took the oath of office, I was wearing a particular pair of boots. About 50 years ago, in 1968, my father wore these boots while in the Army. About 20 years later, in my late teenage years, I ended up with the same size feet as my father, so for many years I never bought footwear as I would just wear hand-me-downs, including this pair of boots. In my late teens and early 20's I worked for an A&P supermarket where these boots served primarily as my work shoes; so when I put on the boots, it was time to go to work.

Eventually, I moved on, left the grocery store, and began buying other shoes, so I no longer wore the boots on a daily basis. However, I've made it a point to wear them on certain occasions. They came out at my high

school graduation, then when I graduated from college, a master's degree ceremony followed, then my JD, and now today. Okay, so why do I do this? At these special occasions, where there is celebration, and rightfully so, there is the urge to feel like you are on top of the world. I do this to ground myself, honor my history, and remember where I came from. When I look down at these boots on such occasions, I am reminded that this is not the finish line, and just like when I used to put these on regularly, that it's time to get to work.

So what we need to get to work on are three initiatives for the 2018-2020 biennium. These are not easy issues, but if we are to continue to be a successful organization we must address and attempt to move forward on them. The three initiatives involve (1) developing and implementing new systems to address inactive and weak chapters throughout the Fraternity, (2) developing and implementing more value added programming for our International events, so that for the financial health of the organization such events become self-sustaining, and (3) the international expansion of Phi Alpha Delta.

These are not easy goals, they will be difficult to achieve, but we must address these issues. At this time I reminded of a quote by one of our esteemed Brothers from Plains, Georgia, where he stated the following: "Our dreams are big—our hopes high—our goals long-term—and the path is difficult. But the only failure is not to try." –Jimmy Carter (Keener Chapter '86). The motto of my graduate and law school, Seton Hall University, is also particularly appropriate. That motto is "Hazard Zet Forward," which translates into modern English as "Whatever the Peril, Ever Forward."

So my brothers and sisters, I ask you to please join me in honoring our history, remembering where we came from, and helping Phi Alpha Delta move forward by remaining grounded, putting on your boots, and getting to work with me. Together we can do this. Thank you.

# The Distinguished Service Chapter

An award was established in 1966 by the then Supreme Executive Board, now the International Executive Board (IEB), known as the Distinguished Service Chapter (DSC). The DSC is composed of members of the Fraternity who have been selected in recognition of unusual and outstanding service to the Fraternity. With selections made unanimously by the IEB, election is the highest honor awarded by the Fraternity.

Congratulations to the following 2018 inductees on receiving this well-deserved honor.



#### **Melody Crick Peters**

Melody joined the Truman Chapter at Seattle University School of Law, where she served as Marshal, Vice Justice, and ultimately Justice. In 2004, Melody received third place in

the Alex A. Hotchkiss Outstanding Chapter Justice award. She passed the Washington State Bar Exam in 2004 and was appointed District I Justice in March 2005.

Melody was recognized at both the 2010 Convention and the 2015 Leadership Summit with the Stan Jones Outstanding District Justice Award. At the 2014 Convention, Melody was awarded the Meritorious Service Award. She also attended P.A.D. Day at the Supreme Court of the U.S. on June 1, 2015 and was sworn in to the Supreme Court Bar.



#### **Robert Schimmel**

Robert Schimmel was initiated into the Richmond A. Rasco Chapter in his first year at the University of Miami School of Law. He served as Rasco's Vice Justice and Justice. In his third year, the chapter unanimously elected him

Justice Emeritus. Bob was a founding member of the South Dade County Alumni Chapter and served as its initial Justice. He served from 1986–1992 as District Justice for the State of Florida (then District 20).

In 1992, Bob was elected to the position of International Associate Tribune where he served until 1996 when he was elected to the position of International Chief Tribune. He served as Chief Tribune from 1996 to 2006. Brother Schimmel was presented with the Fraternity's Meritorious Service Award recognizing a lifetime of dedication and service to P.A.D.



#### Joseph E. Deems

Joseph E. Deems attended Southwestern University School of Law where, in 1971, he was initiated into the Sammis Chapter. Upon his initiation, he was elected chapter Justice, and served as

Clerk the following year.

Brother Deems served as District III Justice from 1974–1978, when he was elected to the position of Chief Tribune of the International Tribunal. In 1982, Joe was elected to the International Executive Board as International Marshal. Thereafter, he served as International Historian, International Treasurer, International Secretary, International Advocate, International Board Member At Large, International Advocate, International Vice Justice, and, in 1998, was elected International Justice.



#### **Larry Crigler**

In 1968, Larry Crigler joined the Hoffman Chapter at the Salmon P. Chase College of Law. He attended the 1970 Biennial Convention in New Orleans as a student, where he was the recipient

of a P.A.D. Service Scholarship. He served as Clerk, then Justice of Hoffman Chapter.

Larry was a District Justice from 1972–1976 when he was elected to the International Executive Board where he served until 1990—serving as International Justice from 1988–90. While on the IEB, he served as President of P.A.D. Public Service Center and Chairman of the Endowment Loan Committee. He has attended 24 P.A.D. Conventions and has served as Chairman of the Credential Committee, Constitution and By-Law Committee, and Nominating Committee, among others.

#### **Project Linus**

Project Linus is a national service organization headquartered in Belton, Missouri, with local chapters all over the United States. These

chapters accept donations of handmade washable blankets for distribution to infants and children up to age 18 who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need.

Thank you to everyone who donated at Convention this year! We collected 24 blankets and donated them to the Central Kentucky Chapter. This August they distributed more than 1,100 blankets to over 30 agencies, including 6 hospitals, Ronald McDonald House, Red Cross, medical agencies and shelters, and police and fire departments. If you would still like to donate, you can still send your blankets to the Chapter Coordinator: Lisa Kepf, 6018 Harkness Lane, Versailles, KY 40383. Many other kinds of blankets and toys were donated, but since Project Linus does not accept commercially manufactured items, they were donated to the Hope Center of Lexington.

District XVIII donated the most handmade blankets at Convention—14! How? District XVIII Justice Jennifer Remare (Frankfurter Chapter, Boston Alumni Chapter) plans for this service project all biennium! The District XVIII chapters also upped their game this past biennium with at least one blanket-making night co-sponsored by Boston Alumni and MacLean Chapters.

We hope to continue this service project at the next Convention. Watch for posts about Project Linus in the 2020 P.A.D. Take The Pledge Facebook Group, future issues of *The Reporter*, and other communications.

# Glam Chapter—Playful. Adventurous. Dignified.

The driving force behind all things "extra," it is no surprise that Glam Chapter's inaugural year was anything but modest.

As the past biennium came to an end in Lexington,

Kentucky, Glam Chapter launched a fraternal market. Initially conceived as a sea of purple and gold professional clothing and accessories, the Closet widened the color wheel and added recreational ware, all donated by (S)PADs.

Shoppers danced around the Closet and showed off their purchases on social media. All proceeds were donated to the International Foundation (over \$600) and unsold items were given to the Hope Center, a dynamic shelter in Lexington. Fraternal pins and cuff links also added to Glam Chapter's success. The real accomplishment from Convention, however, is that proof of concept was established.

Lighthearted social media tête-à-têtes birthed Glam Chapter and the Closet is just the first in what will be a long line of Glam service productions. How-to events about professional attire/accessories, clothing drives, and partnerships with other unofficial chapters/ initiatives where service projects align (e.g. creating blankets for Project Linus with P.A.D. Yarniacs or having a Paint Your Own Workout Tank fundraiser to support the P.A.D. Health Initiative) are just the tip of the iceberg. Chapters are already planning Glam events locally and Glam Chapter Committee members are already brainstorming on ways to bring even more value to the Closet in 2020.

## In Memoriam: Fredrick J. V

It is with heavy heart that we announce the passing of Fredrick J. Weitkamp on September 1, 2018. Fred was a P.A.D. icon and legend. He led Phi Alpha Delta as Executive Director for 40 years. Under his leadership, the fraternity prospered and grew exponentially.

Fred Weitkamp obtained his B.A. from Occidental College and his LL.B. from the University of Southern California where he was initiated into P.A.D.'s Erskine M. Ross Chapter.

In 1952, he became Executive Director of the Fraternity and served in that capacity until 1992, while also maintaining a very active full-time law practice. During his period of his service to the Fraternity, the number of chapters increased from 45 to 172, and total membership increased from 30,000 to 140,000. He organized and directed 21 Biennial Conventions of our Fraternity.

He was instrumental in the founding of the Professional Fraternity Association, a national organization of all professional fraternities and sororities representing over one and a half million people. He served as President of that organization in 1978–1979. In 1990 he received the Association's Career Achievement Award, which is the highest honor conferred by that organization.

At the 1978 Convention, he was inducted into the Distinguished Service Chapter of P.A.D.; at the time, an honor conferred upon only eight members of the Fraternity previously.

He is a past president of many community organizations including the Granada Hills Chamber of Commerce, the Granada Hills Optimist Club, the Board of Trustees of Granada Hills Methodist Church, and the Board of Trustees of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Northridge, California. He was named Granada Hills "Man of the Year" in two separate years. Until recently, he also served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Bank of Granada Hills (1983–2006).

He and his son, John F. Weitkamp, were partners in the law firm of Weitkamp & Weitkamp located in Granada Hills, CA for 30 years.

My father, our brother, Fredrick J. Weitkamp, passed away September 1. The above is his "official" P.A.D. biography. And yet it does not even begin to scratch the surface of who he was and what he accomplished for our Fraternity. In this regard, I do have a unique perspective because I grew up in the Weitkamp household immersed in P.A.D.-because every day my father "practiced" P.A.D. just as he practiced law. Phi Alpha Delta was not an occasional involvement for my father, but rather a part of his being.

Integrity, compassion, courage, and professional service were not corny words bandied about by my father, but words to live by-concepts with which he was imbued and exemplified to the end. Over the years, Fred Weitkamp, as the Executive Director of our Fraternity, had contact with a great many of our members. He touched many lives. He molded young lawyers. He was

an example of how fraternalism could be integrated into the practice of law. It was no accident that the largest attendance at a P.A.D. Convention up to that time was in 1992, when he retired as Executive Director.

And even after retirement from the ED position, he has remained much a part of Phi Alpha Delta, bringing along his successors, providing advice and direction when requested—otherwise remaining in the background. On two occasions, we had the opportunity to work closely together when we both served as Interim Executive Directors during 1994–1995 and part of 1998, when the Fraternity was in between full-time Executive Directors.

Those were special times.

His impact was palpable. Even after his retirement as Executive Director, and until I entered semiretirement, P.A.D. attorneys would come up to me in court and ask me about Fred and how he was doing.

My father introduced me to the world of P.A.D. at my ripe old age of 9 and I loved it. I couldn't get enough of it and I still can't. His love of our Fraternity and its members was evident and infectious. I was privileged to grow up in P.A.D. and learn from him and so many others. It is a lifetime that I will not forget and one that made my father my brother.

Thank you, dad. You will be missed.




